

In March 2015 the Health for Haiti water filtration system began providing clean, safe drinking water to the community in Grande Saline, Haiti. This is the only source of clean water in the area. Hundreds of people rely on the system for water each month. There is no doubt that access to clean water has changed and saved lives in this community.

## Clean Water for Grande Saline



The system is currently powered by gas generators. They are expensive and unreliable. **We hope to convert the system to clean, sustainable solar power this year.** We have a plan to build a pavilion and install solar panels on the roof. All materials and labor will be purchased in Haiti. The pavilion will serve as a community gathering place, and will provide income to help pay the system operator salaries. We are in need of donations to purchase the building materials and solar panels.
